We launched our mobile learning application!

Since September 2018, we are working on our MIGRANTS IN CARE - Mobile Learning App. Now we are happy to announce that the application is ready to be used!

The mobile learning application is developed for migrants who would like to work in the care sector and with elderly. It is open and free for everyone and creates an individual and unique learning pathway for the user. It offers seven learning units for various themes, in which the user will be able to learn in different work-based

situations about the daily care sector.

It can be used to support self-directed learning besides work-based learning or learning in vocational education centres.

Our mobile app is available in five languages: German, French, Serbian, Arabic and Turkish.

We held our Final Conference on the 30th of June 2021 via Zoom during which we introduced our work: the mobile learning
